What does remembrance of the Shoah mean for our future and how do we want to remember it in the future?

What does this imply for pedagogical work with children and young people at historical sites?

Exchange ideas with pedagogical students from Israel, Poland, and Germany over two semesters, travel together and develop new methods for schools and historical sides!

The seminar units in spring 2021 will focus on different approaches and concepts of Holocaust education and on getting to know the perspectives of all participants. On a joint trip (possibly to Lublin and Lviv in September 2021 – depending on the pandemic situation), you will gain insights into the pedagogical approaches of the memorial sites there and exchange best practice examples and experiences in political education with fellow participants face to face. In fall/winter 2021, you will develop methods for discussing remembrance with children and young people at schools in small groups. You will work closely with institutions involved in political education and memorial work for a deeper insight into the practice and work together with them in developing methods. The project is a cooperation of the Western Galilee College, the Pedagogical University of Krakow, and the Free University of Berlin as well as the Auschwitz Jewish Center and the Kreuzberg Initiative against Anti-Semitism. It is financed by the EVZ-Foundation.

There is no participation fee. Transportation, accommodation, and basic meal costs of the trip are covered. English skills at B2 level are required. The project is open for students studying humanities and pedagogy, incl. history, historical tourism and archival studies.
